LANGUAGE ARTS:

- Refer to details in a text when drawing inferences
- Determine a theme of a story, poem, or drama from the details in the text
- Use details from the text to describe in depth a character, setting, or event in a story or drama
- Compare and contrast the point of view from which stories are narrated
- Determine the main idea of the text and explain how it is supported by key details
- Describe the overall structure in a text
- Explain how an author uses reasons and evidence to support particular points in a text
- Determine the meaning of general academic and domain-specific words or phrases from at 4th grade text
- Interpret information presented and explain how the information contributes to understanding of text

Math:

SOCIAL STUDIES:

- Identify and describe the 6 KY Regions
- Identify early cultures (Native American, Appalachian, pioneers) in KY and explain their similarities and differences
- Use geographic tools to identify and describe natural resources and other physical characteristics in regions of KY.
- Identify significant historical documents, symbols, songs, and selected readings (state flag, United We Stand Divided We Fall, My Old Kentucky Home) specific to KY and explain their Historical significance
- Identify the tree branches of KY government, explain the basic duties of each branch

Science:

- Observe/describe motion, including pushing and pulling that affect motion
- Understand what Earth materials are and that changes occur
- Understand the earth-sun-moon interactions resulting in shadows, moon phases, and day and night
- Observe to compare/classify organisms based on likeness and differences
- Look for patterns that lead to offspring are much like their parents, but not exactly
- Observe fast and slow changes caused by nature, recognizing changes that humans and other organisms cause
- Observe fossils found in their environment
- Understand heat production in simple earth and physical systems
- Knowledge that species depend on one another and the environment for survival
- Understand ecosystems by studying the habitats of many types of local organisms and investigate how they survive
